<p>Intellectual Skills (Reading) - Formulate safe and effective clinical judgements guided by the nursing process, clinical reasoning and evidenced base practice (Refer to KBOR ADN Alignment) Outcome Status: Active</p>	<p>Direct - Kaplan Integrative testing (reading data, assessing and concluding) Benchmark: 80% of the enrolled students will obtain a NCLEX probability success score of 65% or greater on the final Kaplan exit exam. The ability to read with precision for this exam directly correlates to the safe and effective clinical judgements, nursing process and reasoning. This data can be pulled from the exit statistics. Schedule: Assess end of the semester in May and report Bi-Annually on even years</p>		
	<p>Direct - Clinical Evaluation Tool Benchmark: 80% of the enrolled students will obtain a 78% clinical evaluation demonstrating effective clinical judgements guided by the nursing process within the clinical setting 100% of the time. Students will demonstrate ability to assist in patient education and safe medication management. Schedule: Assess at the end of the semester in May and report Bi-Annually on even years.</p>
